

Kaye Herth, Ph.D., R.N., F.A.A.N.

Dr. Herth is Dean Emeritus at Minnesota State University, Mankato. She has extensive clinical, teaching, and administrative experience. Her experiences in education and clinical practice roles have been far reaching and have included experiences at several universities and in hospitals, hospices, and community health settings. Her research has focused on hope, humor, and grief in those individuals with a chronic or terminal illness and the impact on their family/significant others, as well as homeless families and children. Her instruments to measure hope in adults have been translated into 33 foreign languages and are used throughout the world. Recently she has completed development and testing of a tool to measure hope in children. She has over 68 publications in refereed professional journals and over 210 presentations at regional, national, and international professional conferences. She has co-authored a book on Hope and Hopelessness and has published chapters in eight major nursing texts addressing hope, humor, and grief. Dean Herth consults with students, clinicians, and researchers across the globe and serves as a manuscript reviewer for seven professional journals. Dr. Herth has received numerous honors and awards for her scholarship, leadership, and teaching including her selection as a Fellow in the American Academy of Nursing, induction into the Sigma Theta Tau International Nursing Honor Society Research Hall of Fame as well as numerous other awards and recognitions.
