

Dr. Vamik Volkan is an Emeritus Professor of Psychiatry at the University of Virginia, a former president of the International Society of Political Psychology, the Virginia Psychoanalytic Society, and the American College of Psychoanalysts and the Emeritus President of the International Dialogue Initiative (IDI). Starting in early 1980s he applied a growing theoretical and field-proven base of knowledge to issues such as ethnic tension, racism, national identity, terrorism, societal trauma, transgenerational transmissions, leader-follower relationships, and other aspects of national and international conflict. He was a member of the International Negotiation Network (INN) under the directorship of the former President Jimmy Carter (1989-2000). He was nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize for five times; letters of support were sent from 27 countries. Dr. Volkan is the author, coauthor or editor of sixty books.
